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ACHILLES TENDON REPAIR PROTOCOL

8 Weeks Post-op

- Brace: CAM walker
- Ambulation:
 - o FWB as of 6-8 weeks post op
- ROM:
 - Gentle AROM/PROM to tolerance
 - Seated BAPS
- Strengthening:
 - o Isometric Eversion/Inversion/PF/DF
 - o Knee extension exercises (SAQ, LAQ, SLR)
 - o Knee flexion exercises (Ham sets, Hamstring curls)
 - o Hip strengthening (Clams, Bridges)

10-12 Weeks Post-op

- Brace: CAM walker
- ROM:
 - o Progress gradually as tolerated
 - o Talocrural and subtalar joint mobilizations per patient need
- Strengthening:
 - Ankle and toe isometrics/isotonics
 - o Toe curls
 - Knee strengthening: quads, hamstrings
 - o Hip strengthening: i.e., SLR- all planes, clams (I and II), bridges

3 Months Post-op

- **Brace**: Transition from CAM to corset brace at 12 weeks post-op.
- **ROM**:
 - o Progress to full ROM
 - o Talocrural and subtalar joint mobilizations per patient need
- Strengthening:
 - o Progress LE strengthening in both OKC & CKC
 - o Progress Balance activities: perturbations, vary surfaces
- Balance activities: vary surfaces, add perturbations if appropriate

- Aerobic:
 - o Stationary Bike
 - o Elliptical
 - o Swimming

5 months post op

- **ROM/Strengthening/Balance**: Continue to progress toward sports/activity specific exercises
- Aerobic:
 - o Light jog
 - o Elliptical
 - o Bike
 - o Stair Climber

6 months post op

• Begin sports-specific training

8-9 months post op

• Full sports release per physician discretion
